





PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS

Partnerships

At Luzerne Music Center, community and collaboration is at the heart of what we do. We're proud to have partnerships with similarly-missioned youth organizations, aiming to provide access to education in the arts. Some of our main partnerships included: Equity Arc (formerly NIMAN), the Philadelphia Music Alliance for Youth (PMAY) and the Juilliard Music Advancement Program (MAP). Public Performances

Throughout the season, our students participated in more than twenty concerts in 2023. These performances featured a diverse range of musical settings, from solo and chamber music showcases and workshops for student composers, to symphony orchestra and piano prelude concerts. Offered free of charge to the public, these performances attracted local audiences who eagerly visited our campus to witness and appreciate the exceptional talents of our students. Additionally, our students and faculty had multiple opportunities to participate in intimate off-campus performances strengthening the bonds in our local community.

Elective Classes

This summer, we introduced elective classes to our curriculum for both Junior and Senior Sessions. These choice-based classes allowed students to elect into particular areas of interest beyond musical performance, and showcased some of our outstanding faculty expertise in these topics as well. Classes included Vocal and Jazz Studies, Composition, Improvisation, Preparing to Major in Music, Leadership and Advocacy in the Arts, Performance Anxiety and Musicology and Music Theory courses.



Philadelphia Orchestra

One of the highlights of our summer is our connection with The Philadelphia Orchestra. In addition to our Luzerne Chamber Music Festival concerts, we also brought our students to various concerts at the Saratoga Performing Arts Center, featuring these world-class musicians. In addition to attending performances, we hosted 11 masterclasses with The Philadelphia Orchestra musicians on our campus. Our students were invited to a meet-and-greet conversation at Saratoga Performing Arts Center following a concert performance, including speaking with Yannick Nézet-Séguin, Ricardo Morales, Amy Oshiro Morales and piano soloist Bruce Liu. Guest Conductor Miguel Harth-Bedoya graciously dedicated his time to pay a visit to our campus and provide valuable coaching to our students. We also cannot forget the continuation of our annual tradition of the LMC-Philadelphia softball game at the Lake Luzerne Little League field!

SUMMER CONCERTS

Amidst our student performances, the Luzerne Chamber Music Festival proudly featured four captivating guest artist concerts alongside six extraordinary performances by our esteemed faculty. These concerts not only elevated the musical experience for our talented students but also resonated deeply with local and visiting audiences, enriching the cultural life of our region.


Fabulous Philadelphians: Musicians of The Philadelphia Orchestra



Jeffrey B. Ziegler Recital Hall and Jack Lawrence Museum
